Dear Parishioners.

Can I draw your attention to the on-line Youth Alpha (see below). It is for people 14+ and starts this Thursday 18th March. Bit short notice, but if you miss the start I expect you can still join in. Please bring it to the attention of any young people you know.

On Tuesday this week we "celebrate" the anniversary of the first lock-down. Boris Johnson has declared it to be a National Day of Reflection with a minute's silence at midday and doorstep vigils of light at 8 pm. The Bishops of England and Wales have filled this out by asking us to make it a Day of Prayer and to have our churches open for exposition. I am therefore going to have Sacred Heart Church open from 6 pm - 7 pm that evening. I attach the Bishops' statement and I am sure you will also be able to pick it up of the Diocesan website.

Last week I told you about the Easter Triduum and published the times. We can keep it publicly but somewhat reduced, so the ceremonies will be quite short. For those of you who are not able to attend in person, the Bishops are asking you to attend on line with your own Diocesan Bishop, in our case at St. Chad's with Archbishop Bernard. Go to St. Chad's website or the Diocesan website for details. You can also "attend" the Chrism Mass on-line. This year most of the priests are having to do this.

On Thursday this week we have the Solemnity of the Annunciation of our Lord, one of the greatest feasts of the year and the beginning of our salvation. It is, of course, exactly 9 months before Christmas. It is a day to get to Mass if you possibly can.

It is now time to make your confession before Easter. It is one of the precepts of the Church that we should make our confession before/at Easter. I shall be available after the Saturday & Sunday Masses in the undercroft at Sacred Heart for this. Alternatively you can phone me and make an appointment. We can't use the confined space of the confessional.

Next Sunday 28th March is Palm Sunday and the start of Holy Week. It is also the weekend that the clocks change. They go forward an hour so it seems like getting to Church an hour early.

The Gospel this Sunday is about the Greeks who wanted to "see Jesus". Jesus says the his "hour" has come and likens it to a seed dying in the ground so as to germinate and grow to bear a harvest. This hour is going to be the time when Jesus is glorified, not in the way the world would think of glorifying someone, but by his being lifted up on the cross. He will then "draw all men to myself". He now draws us into Holy Week for us to participate in the paschal mystery of our salvation to be set free to live life to the full in the Kingdom of God even now in the nastiness of the present age. Thanks be to God.
