That is half true! The other half is as important for our life of faith and it is good to be aware of it. The first half of Advent lasts from the First Sunday of Advent to 16<sup>th</sup> December. The focus of this first half of Advent is the Second Coming of Christ in Glory at the End of Time. So, it is really not to do with Christmas and Bethlehem. That comes later. But listen closely to the prayers of the Mass and you will hear how often the phrase 'until you come again' or 'Second Coming' are mentioned all the year round...
