Message from Father Tim

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As we begin this new year, and the Christmas Season draws to a close. We have a short period of Ordinary Time before the Season of Lent (which begins quite early this year!) But it is a good time to consider what place prayer and the life of faith can play in our daily routines.

The Church is still in the midst of the Synodal Process led by Pope Francis. The Holy Father understands that in order to move forward, the Church must be open to change. We as clergy and parishioners must also recognise that the Church of today might look different from what we have known before. What is our response? Despondency and despair – or trust in the God who always walks with us?

Perhaps the most urgent prayer for the year ahead is Prayer for Vocations. Let us pray that our own parish may produce priests for the future. Without priests, we cannot have the Eucharist, or the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick.

Wednesday 14th February is Ash Wednesday when we begin our Lenten journey together. During these 40 days we are remembering the 40 days that Jesus spent in the desert, the temptations he experienced there and his time of prayer and fasting. During this penitential season, as we journey with Christ so we embrace a period of penance, prayer and works of charity, as we make our way with Christ towards Holy Week and then journey onwards towards the great joy of the Resurrection and all that Easter brings. During Lent we try to choose ways once again to help us to walk more fully in the footsteps of Christ as we seek to recommit ourselves to living as He lived and as we seek to love God and our brothers and sisters more deeply.
